

**RESOLUTION 2026-03**  
**No Carbon Capture Pipelines**

Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Grant County, Oklahoma as follows,

1. The Board opposes the construction of any new Carbon Capture Pipelines across Grant County or the conversion of any existing pipeline to one transporting Co2.
2. The Board urges other Oklahoma Counties to pass similar resolutions.
3. The Board urges the Governor, State Legislators, the Corporation Commissioners, and appropriate business leaders in the state to oppose future Carbon Capture Pipelines in the State as well as repeal any that may have already been approved.
4. The Board further urges our Congregational delegation to reject the false narrative of the "Green Energy" fanatics in favor or true science as provided by the scientists with the Cornwall Alliance for the Stewardship of Creation. We urge them to oppose any unnecessary federal expenditure with the purpose of slowing down the growth and ultimately reducing our national debt.
